I am a current student, when will I return to class?

The SAC Adult Education program will continue to offer online support for all current students. Please contact your instructor for more information.

All GED classes are scheduled to end on Friday April 03, 2020. However, if you need additional support after the end of the cohort, please contact your instructor or Program Coordinator.

What about my attendance, will I be dropped from the program?

No, your absentee will be counted as regular excused attendance via General Emergency code.

When will the next GED Preparation Class start?

St. Augustine College is committed to following the guidance of our local governments and health authorities to resume in-person GED classes as soon as it is safe to do so.

In the meantime, all classes will be moved to distance learning – Online Instructions.

The Innovative 10 Week GED Bridge to a Better Future Program – New Cohort is beginning on [May 4TH to July 3rd](#).

- Online classes are completely FREE.
- We'll conduct online orientation for all students, which will include training on Zoom and Canvas.
- Classes will take place five days a week: **Monday – Friday** on two different schedules Morning **9 AM-12:30 PM** or Evening **6 PM-9:30PM**. In both English or Spanish.
- All GED students who complete the program and obtain their GED will automatically qualify for a FREE college incentive course!

What do I need to do to earn my General Equivalency Degree (GED)?

Students must pass GED exams of the following four major subjects:

Science
Social Studies
Math
Language Arts

Students must also pass the U.S. Constitution exam.

Can I take college credit classes while in the GED program? Yes, SAC students may qualify to participate in our Sendero al Exito Program in which they can take both college credit classes, and the GED preparation courses needed to complete their official GED exams.

Are undocumented and/or documented students able to enroll into Adult Education classes?

Yes, U.S. citizenship is not a requirement to enroll into any Adult Education classes in the State of Illinois
