Techniques to Improve Student Engagement in the Online Environment

- 1. Assign groups to research a topic and design interactive presentations to deliver to classmates
- 2. Use a creative icebreaker on the first day of the term to build community (for example, students introduce themselves using an adjective for each letter of their name)
 - M-otivated
 - A -dventurous
 - R-esponsible
 - I -ntelligent
 - A-rtistic
- 3. Use multimedia resources instead of relying on lecture (video, podcast, art, etc.)
- 4. Invite a guest speaker who has expertise in the content area
- 5. Keep lectures short (15 minutes) with activities in between
- 6. Give opportunities for students to produce creative projects rather than memorize information (Bloom's Taxonomy)
- 7. Design activities that appeal to all kinds of learners (audio, visual, kinesthetic, social, individual)
- 8. Use apps like <u>Kahoot</u> (quiz/game), <u>Socrative</u> (formative assessment), or <u>Quizlet</u> (good for vocabulary)
- 9. Use breakout rooms (Zoom) or other platforms like Google Meet, <u>Slack</u>, or <u>Big Blue Button</u>
- 10. Compose a Google Doc or Google Slides presentation as a class- everyone can contribute simultaneously
- 11. Consider observing a peer instructor's class for additional ideas
